



ADMISSION PROCESS

St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing offers a one year nursing program of study which qualifies the graduate to take the National Council of License Examination (NCLEX) leading to licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN). The complete course of study is based on our nursing curriculum and twelve college general education courses. The prerequisite courses are listed below. All courses must be completed with a C or better at an accredited college. Science courses must be less than 10 years old.



All of the prerequisites must be completed before the start of nursing school

This is a full time day program which encompasses one year.

Tuition is currently \$25,000-financial aid is available for qualified students.
